DESCRIPTION	"Procurement is the management of the company's external resources with the aim of ensuring availability of all the goods, services, skills and knowledge needed to perform, maintain and manage the company's primary and supportive activities under favourable conditions." (van Weele/Eßig 2017) The students will learn what strategic procurement in the public sector means and will also learn hot to formulate procurement strategies. Challenging concepts, such as performance based contracting, life cycle costing and cooperative procurement will be presented. Moreover the course entails interactive elements, such as the case study to explore procurements strategy potential and a case study to experience and discuss issues along the (operative) procurement process.
