<b>OBJECTIVES</b>	<p>Collusion, corruption and incompetence are strategic complements that are mutually supportive in public procurement.</p> <p>Rather than rely on weak institutional arrangements in a context of systemic corruption – such as whistleblowing, centralization or Anticorruption authorities - the reduction of inefficient expenditures in public administrations comes necessary through the reorganization of the contracting authorities towards objectives of performance, accountability and professionalization.</p>
